Paired with the Catholic Studies six-course, graduate-level Certificate in Mission & Culture of Catholic Education, our Fellows develop a philosophy of education rooted in the Church's 2000-year-old tradition as they work with experienced mentor teachers and administrators.

Who can be an MC Fellow?

This 10-month program is ideal for energetic, faithfilled graduating seniors from all disciplines and backgrounds, as well as those who have served as campus missionaries, who have a sense of wonder and awe, a love for young people, and desire to serve in our Catholic schools.

- A fully funded master's degree in Catholic Studies (upon employment at a Catholic school in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis). The six certificate courses apply towards a full MA degree.
- A teacher credentialing certificate from the Institute for Catholic Liberal Education.
- A masters-level certificate from the Institute for Catholic School Leadership.
